

This could be anything from items with purely sentimental value, to that which provides financial security to your closest family and friends.



Key things to remember

You should keep your Will somewhere safe (e.g. with your solicitor) and ensure your executors know where it is kept.

If you do not have a Will, the law will decide who inherits your estate, so – in writing one – you can be at peace, knowing that your loved ones will be looked after, and that any other related wishes you have will be fulfilled.

Keep your Will updated, as it may change under the following circumstances:

- Changes in relationship status
- Buying a new home/moving home
- Changes in your family
- Birth/adoption of a child
- Receipt of inheritance.

Glossary

Assets Everything that you own, including your share in joint assets.

Beneficiary Person or organisation who will receive a gift in your Will.

Codicil Legal document that makes an amendment or an addition to your Will.

Estate Your property, money and possessions.

Executor Someone you chose, and name, who is responsible for carrying

out the wishes in your Will. They could be friends, family,

or your solicitor. You can have up to four executors.

Inheritance Tax Tax paid on someone's estate. If your estate exceeds £325,000,

you will pay 40% on the excess. Gifts to your spouse, or a charity, do not get taxed (if you leave 10% of your estate to a charity, inheritance tax is reduced to 36%). www.gov.uk/inheritance-tax

A gift left in your Will to an individual or an organisation. Legacy/Bequest

Pecuniary Gift Specified amount of money e.g. £1000.

Probate The process of dealing with a Will.

Residuary Gift Percentage of your 'residue': what's left of your estate, after other

gifts, debts and fees are taken into account, e.g. 5% of your residue.

Specific Gift Specific item e.g. jewellery, antiques, collectables...

Testator/Testatrix Man/woman whose Will is being written.

Witnesses Two people who must be present when a person

is signing and dating their Will.


