More safe and happy childhoods

We want to rewrite the future for vulnerable children across the UK.

A lot has changed since we began in 1869, but our ambition – to give children safe and happy childhoods - shines just as bright. Our vast experience has given us a unique insight into the issues facing children, young people and families. We know what needs to be done and, crucially, our frontline staff have the expertise to deliver.

Today, we have over 400 services across England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. We provide support to families from pregnancy, through childhood and into young adulthood. Our services intervene early to help families stay together. And, through our children's centres and family hubs, we make sure children and young people get the best start in life. We care for children and young people in our children's homes and through our adoption and fostering services. Our internationally acclaimed Blues Programme gives young people the tools to look after their emotional wellbeing. And our award winning service Parent Talk offers free, down-to-earth advice for parents. These are just a few of the many exceptional services we provide to help children thrive.

In 2021-22, we supported over 671,000 children, young people and families, and although we've achieved incredible things for them, we know there is still more to do.



We were a vital lifeline for many during the pandemic. As we learn to live with Covid, the ongoing effects social, health and financial challenges - are still being felt. We've seen an increasing number of children and young people struggling with their mental wellbeing following lockdowns. And the cost of living crisis is further compounding these challenges.

We've applied all our of experience and expertise to develop our ambitious new strategy to help address these challenges. It lays out what we'll do to reach more vulnerable children and young people through our services, in schools and online. And how we'll achieve this by building on our strong and dedicated workforce, our processes, our reputation and our income generating ability.

Our ambition is big. But we believe in the passion and ability of everybody in the Action for Children family - whether they be our staff, volunteers, supporters or partners - to give more vulnerable children a safe and happy childhood.

Our vision is that every child and young person has a safe and happy childhood, and the foundations they need to thrive.

We protect and support children and young people. We do this by providing practical and emotional care and support. We make sure their voices are heard. And we campaign to bring lasting improvements to their lives.

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About our core service areas

Our strategy will focus on developing our services in four core areas. This will allow us to evolve and support more vulnerable children, young people and their families, now and in the future.

Family support



Supporting families to make sure children and young people get the best start in life. Services include:

- Parenting support and early help for children and young people, as well as intensive services to improve family functioning, and avoid care or family breakdown
- Parent Talk, offering free, advice for parents both online and via parenting coaches.
- Support for children and young people who have caring responsibilities.
- Youth services such as employment programmes, services to reduce involvement in anti-social behaviour, crime and substance misuse, and support to help build resilience, skills and networks.
- Spring nurseries and Spring Oscars providing nurseries and childcare.



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Children in care

Caring for children and young people to give them a safe, stable and loving home. Services include:

- Adoption and fostering services.
- Children's homes providing residential care for children and young people.
- Youth services providing advice and support to young people for independent living and housing provision, as well as statutory leaving care services.
- Children's rights and advocacy support, and independent visits.
- A school for children and young people with behavioural, emotional and social difficulties and those with profound and multiple learning difficulties.



Disabled children

Supporting disabled children, young people and their families. Services include:

- Children's homes offering overnight, medium and long term residential care for disabled children and young people.
- Short breaks for disabled children and young people in children's homes, providing respite, independence and access to new opportunities.
- Community support such as leisure, social, out of school and holiday activities for disabled children and young people, as well as in home care, drop in services, community social work and advice services.
- Overnight support or day-care for disabled children in an approved foster carer's home.

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Mental health and wellbeing

Building children and young people's emotional resilience to help them overcome challenges.

Services provide early help and preventative support to children and young people who are suffering from, or at risk of developing, depression and other mental health problems. Services include:

- One-to-one and group programmes providing therapeutic support to help at an early stage, delivered through schools or the community.
- Programmes supporting wellbeing and reducing anxiety and depression, including The Blues and Bouncing Back.
- Mental health literacy programmes to support teachers and other professionals, reduce stigma and increase access to support, such as The Guide.

Strategic goal 1

Grow our services to help more children and young people.

To make a real difference to the increasing number of children, young people and families that need us, we will deliver targeted growth in our four core service areas. And we'll make sure that our charity remains financially sustainable as we do so, to allow us to continue keeping children safe and happy in the future.

By shaping our services with children, young people and families wherever possible, we'll make sure we deliver for their needs. And we'll work collaboratively alongside local authorities and other partners, so services deliver for their needs, ultimately helping more children to thrive.

To achieve this, we plan to:

- Expand our family support services, particularly in areas where we have less presence currently.
- Increase our residential care service by setting up more high quality children's homes that provide stability for children and young people.
- Develop our disability services based on need and set up more short break homes to provide respite, give children and young people the chance to develop independence skills and improve their access to social and leisure opportunities.
- Extend our mental health support for children and young people by creating new services and ways of working with key agencies.



We'll expand our services across the UK, with a focus on growing in England, while also supporting strong growth opportunities across Scotland, Wales and Ireland.

Strategic goal 2

Increase the impact of our work with children and young people.

We're passionate about giving more children safe and happy childhoods. But as we expand our services it's critical that we also work to achieve even better outcomes for children, young people and their families.

To improve our impact we'll continually learn and adapt, tailor our services to individual and local needs and adopt proven practices.

We'll gather data that will help us shape and build on our services, focus our support where it's needed the most, inform our policy influencing and raise awareness of the work we do. So that children and young people have the opportunity to thrive.

To achieve our goals, we'll:

- Continue to improve our services focusing on impact, quality and innovation, by gaining and using evidence and developing our practices.
- Develop a new impact assessment framework, using the data to aid decision making.
- Gain external accreditation for the high standard of our services.

Strategic goal 3

Influence policy decisions to improve the lives of children and young people.

Our services on the ground do incredible work to directly support children, young people and their families. But by influencing policy and public attitudes, we have the opportunity to create change and improve the lives of all children in the UK.


We'll use our expertise and experience in supporting children, young people and their families to make a positive impact on policy areas including early help, early years, poverty and mental health. And we'll work collaboratively with other organisations to achieve the maximum impact.

For example, we'll aim to secure policy change to increase funding for early help services, to protect more children from harm. And influence the roll out of family hubs, to ensure they provide families with the highest quality parenting support.

To make sure we focus our work on the issues that matter most to children and young people, their views will be central to our work and will inform our decision making on influencing policy and beyond.

To achieve our goals, we'll:

- Build our evidence base to influence public policy, by capturing data from our frontline services and commissioning research on key policy areas.



- Increase the impact of our campaigns with the public and our influencing activities with officials and parliamentarians, to build public support and political backing, locally and nationally.
- Integrate the voices of children and young people across the organisation, so they are truly represented in all our work.

Strategic goal 4

Building on our already strong reputation in the children's care sector and across supporting functions, will help us to fill vacancies. And we'll support all staff, empowering them to develop and achieve their potential.

This will help us as we create an inclusive and supportive working environment that motivates staff to stay at Action for Children.

To achieve our goals, we'll:

 Become an inclusive and pro-actively anti-racist charity, with diverse representation at all levels, where staff and volunteers can proudly be themselves.



- Enable colleagues to achieve their potential by supporting their professional development and helping them progress in our charity.
- Develop our leaders, championing a culture and behaviours which are positive and fair, with a focus on wellbeing and opportunities for all.
- Build our reputation as a great place to work, by more effectively communicating the benefits of working at Action for Children.

Strategic goal 6


Increase our financial contribution from fundraising, nurseries and childcare.

As well as helping to fund our work in local communities, income from fundraising, nurseries and childcare has enabled us to offer fresh, innovative services like The Blues Programme and Parent Talk. These award-winning services have made a huge impact on the lives of vulnerable children, young people and their families.

To grow and develop such impactful services, it's vital that we continue to raise funds from donors and through our nurseries and childcare. This contribution also helps us stay financially stable, so that we can be resilient enough to keep supporting children during the tough times.

We aim to increase our fundraising income by building on our existing campaigns and focusing on longer term opportunities. We'll make sure our activities continually move with the times and harness the power of likeminded people to support us in our goals.

By expanding our nurseries and out of schools services we'll provide more of the high quality, good value childcare we're known for, whilst generating funds that will enable us to help more vulnerable children and young people.



To achieve our goals, we'll:

- Evolve and develop our fundraising activities and ways of working, taking a digital first approach. And scale up our campaigns to generate more funds.
- Grow our capabilities to raise income from legacies, major donors, trusts and partnerships, to help fund priority initiatives such as Parent Talk, wellbeing programmes and the Crisis Fund.
- Expand our high quality nursery and childcare services, by adding to and filling the places available, giving us greater potential to invest in the wider charity.

Strategic goal 7

This will mean that more time and money can be spent supporting the children, young people and families who need our help.


To achieve these goals, we'll:
